Senator Pete Flores serves as the Chairman of the Texas Senate Criminal Justice Committee. In 2018, he was the first Hispanic Republican elected to the Texas Senate in history.

Representative Ryan Guillen serves as the Chairman of the Texas House Homeland Security & Public Safety Committee and the Select Committee on Community Safety. In 2022, he made history as the first Republican to win Jim Hogg County in history, and Starr and Duval County since Reconstruction.

Representative J.M. Lozano serves as Chairman of the Texas House Urban Affairs Committee. He made history in 2012 as the first Republican elected to represent Kleberg County in the Texas Legislature.

Representative John Lujan serves as the Vice Chair of the Texas House Juvenile Justice and Family Issues Committee and is the first Republican to represent HD 118.

Representative Janie Lopez made history in 2022 as she became the first Hispanic Republican female ever elected to the Legislature to represent a district in the Rio Grande Valley.

Representative Mano DeAyala is the second Hispanic Republican ever elected to the Legislature out of Harris County and is also the first Hispanic Republican to represent HD 133.
